BE REAL

My first day of teaching my oldest child was probably a typical one. We started off with the pledge of allegiance to the flag and proceeded into our Bible lesson. I was so prepared that I even had coloring pages that went along with our lesson for my two preschoolers to color while I went over the lesson. Of course, the preschoolers finished coloring before the lesson was finished. After our prayer time came math and handwriting while I was trying to juggle keeping the other two occupied instead of tearing up the house. Finally, lunchtime came! Then there was getting the younger two down for naptime so I could work on phonics with my kindergartener. I suppose the first day went as well as could be expected.

Within a couple of weeks, I was starting to feel like a failure though. How was I supposed to give my student the one-on-one instruction he needed while taking care of two preschoolers? What was I supposed to do when my student didn't fully learn the lesson? If I spent another day going over the same lesson, then wouldn't I be "behind"? How could I teach one child kindergarten let alone three children in three different grades in a few years?

Over time I needed help finding therapy for my son for his developmental delays. We had also moved from another state to Kansas and needed to learn new homeschool laws. An addition to our family caused me to reassess how I was going to teach my school-age children and manage a baby. A one-year job lay-off for my husband, the illnesses and deaths of parents, a child with a migraine for 9 months (caused by a food allergy), choosing a new curriculum that we all ended up hating, extracurricular activities, and teenagers all were to follow.

So how did I handle all of this? Prayer. "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 4:6-7).

God provided the answers to my prayers in different ways. My husband was so supportive through it all, listening to me, trying not to give advice sometimes and at other times giving me helpful suggestions. "You're not a slave to your curriculum." "Why don't you do school outside on the deck?" "Take a day off and go to a park/nature center/field trip."

Looking back over the years of homeschooling, God also blessed me with homeschooling friends who knew exactly what I was going through. I am amazed to this day how my heart would be broken and a mom would be right there who I could be real with. She understood the problem, the difficulty, the hurt, the confusion. And even if she didn't have the answer to my specific situation, she would have a shoulder to cry on and comforting words that God knew I needed.

I have had several different circles of homeschooling friends over the years – support group, homeschool sports, church, scouts, and others. One of the most common questions homeschoolers are asked is, “What about socialization?” I know the question is referring to our children, but what about us moms? When you haven't had a conversation with anyone over 4 feet tall all day, you start wondering about your sanity. When the dishes and laundry are piled up, how can you even start to think about sitting down for a devotional without having nagging thoughts about all you need to be up doing? That's when you need to be real with God, pouring out your heart to Him - your Creator, your Sustainer, your Provider, your Helper. And it's okay to ask Him to bring a special friend into your life that will walk alongside you through your homeschooling journey. He knows what we need; we only need to ask. “The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside quiet waters. He restores my soul; He guides me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake” (Psalm 23:1-3).

Many families are starting back to school soon. In your preparations for the new school year, set some “new year” resolutions for yourself. I would recommend a regular devotional time daily if you don't have one established. Be real with God about your doubts and your struggles. Consider keeping a journal or blog, recording some of the day-to-day happenings once or twice a week. Writing about the daily situations is a great outlet, and it will make for interesting reading for you and your family when your journey is done. It is also okay to seek out another homeschooler to be real with. We know none of us is perfect – and neither are our houses or our children – so don't be afraid to share your weaknesses with someone God brings along. Having someone else who is walking along the same path can be comforting and helpful.

And for the veteran homeschooling moms, your wisdom is needed by the new, young teachers. Remember how valuable those who went before you were to the success of your own homeschool, so be ready to pay it forward – be someone who encourages, supports, and comforts. - Be real!
